



Safety Requirements - Best Lap 2025

1. General Provisions

- 1.1 The competition organizer is Hobby Racing MTÜ (80577392).
- 1.2 These safety requirements are mandatory for all registered participants in the Best Lap competitions.
- 1.3 The participant bears full responsibility for following the instructions of the organizers and complying with the prohibitions established on the tracks, as well as for any consequences resulting from them. The participant is also responsible for any damage caused to the track owners.
- 1.4 By registering, the participant confirms with their signature that they agree with the Best Lap liability regulations and competition rules and undertakes to comply with them.

2. Safety Requirements

- 2.1 The driver must fasten the seatbelt while driving.
- 2.2 The driver must wear a protective helmet marked with "E," long-sleeved clothing, long pants, closed-type footwear, and gloves.
- 2.3 All objects inside the vehicle must be securely fastened and must not pose a danger to occupants.
- 2.4 Each vehicle must be equipped with a fire extinguisher with a minimum capacity of 1 kg. The fire extinguisher must be securely fastened in the car and easily accessible to the driver.
- 2.5 Drivers under the influence of alcohol or drugs are not allowed to participate.
- 2.6 No repairs may be carried out on the track. Repairs are only permitted in the pit area or parking lot.
- 2.7 Conduct in the event area:
 - 2.7.1 The maximum speed in the parking lot and pit area is 20 km/h.
 - 2.7.2 Intentional drifting and loud tire warming are prohibited.
 - 2.7.3 Parents are responsible for the safety and behavior of their children.
 - 2.7.4 More specific rules depend on the track and are specified in each event's bulletin.

3. Participant Responsibility

- 3.1 The participant bears full responsibility for any damage to themselves, their property, life, or health, as well as for any damage caused to third parties' property, life, or health.
- 3.2 Any damage caused to the event venue (including the organizers' equipment) due to the participant's actions or negligence must be fully compensated to the event organizers.
- 3.3 Disputes regarding damage to the event venue will primarily be resolved



through negotiations. If an agreement is not reached within 30 days, the dispute will be settled in court.

3.4 If a participant refuses to follow the organizer's instructions and decisions, the organizer may impose a competition ban on them. This ban has no time limits and may be changed at the organizer's discretion.

3.5 The participant must understand that participating in the competition involves potential risks to health and life.

3.6 The participant agrees not to make any claims or complaints against the competition organizers regarding accidents, injuries, or other damages caused during the competition.

3.7 The organizer may conduct alcohol testing using a breathalyzer. If the permissible limit (0.1 per mille in exhaled air) is exceeded or if the participant refuses to take the test, they will be disqualified from the competition.

3.8 During training sessions and practice runs, passengers are allowed to sit next to the driver. The same rules and requirements that apply to drivers also apply to passengers.

3.9 The participant bears full responsibility for the safety and life of passengers in the car during competitions or practice runs.

3.10 Each participant is responsible for familiarizing themselves with, understanding, and complying with the rules.
